## NEW INITIATIVES, PUBLICATIONS AND RESOURCES

The Scottish Government has published its **Zero Waste Plan**. This plan sets the strategic direction for waste policy for Scotland, informed by improved understanding of the environmental consequences of how we use and dispose of resources, and by the requirements of European legislation. The Zero Waste Plan is underpinned by a determination to achieve the best overall outcomes for Scotland's environment, by making best practical use of the approach in the waste management hierarchy: waste prevention, reuse, recycling and recovery. Scotland's Chief Statistician has published Key 2009 Reported **Road Casualty Statistics**. This bulletin presents provisional statistics of road injury accidents and casualties reported to the police.

2009 provisional figures show there were 15,013 reported road casualties, (575 or four per cent fewer than 2008), the lowest since 1949. There were:

- 216 fatalities: 54 (or 20 per cent) fewer than 2008

- 2,269 seriously injured: 301 (or 12 per cent) fewer than 2008
- 2,485 killed or seriously injured: 355 (or 13 per cent) fewer than 2008
- 12,528 slightly injured: 220 (or two per cent) fewer than 2008
- 1,474 child casualties, 215 (13 per cent) fewer than in 2008, including five fatalities: 15 fewer deaths than in 2008

SURF and the Scottish Government's Scottish Centre for Regeneration (SCR) have jointly produced a Learning Point paper on *Tackling Multiple Deprivation in Communities – the ongoing challenge*.

The report draws out a set of learning outcomes from a recent workshop on the same theme. The participative event brought together a range of relevant practitioners to draw on their experience and knowledge in order to explore key issues and lessons for continuing successful place-based regeneration.

The focal point of the event was the recognition that sustaining area-based approaches to regeneration and anti-poverty activity remains an important priority
