Kirktonhall Glen

A remnant of the original Kirktonhall Estate, this picturesque Glen leads from West Kilbride to Seamill following the Kilbride Burn to its entry into the Firth of Clyde at Seamill. The site was gifted to the town in 1928 by the owner Mr Robert Barr. It is currently largely managed and maintained by the Council with assistance from the West Kilbride Amenity Society.

The Glen is comprised of broadleaved plantation woodland and parkland, amenity grassland and sports facilities. It benefits from a number of paths created and improved in the 1990's by members of the Amenity Society. It is now a popular destination for walking and forms the main park in the centre of the village. Whilst enjoying the tranquillity of the Glen, you can visit the Hunterston Brooch Garden commemorating the local find of a 1200-year-old Celtic brooch, now in the Museum of Scotland and the Marsh Garden designed locally and created with the help of BBC Scotland's Beechgrove Garden.

Notable developments in West Kilbride include the designation of the town as Scotland's Craft and Design Town by the Scottish Parliament in 2000 and the development of the Starling Wood and Ralph Garratt Memorial Gardens near to the town Centre. The Craft and Design Town also won the Department of Trade and Industry's Enterprising Britain competition at both the Scottish and National level in 2007.
