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

Raised bogs

Raised bogs are peat-forming ecosystems that have developed during thousands of years of peat accumulation, to such an extent that the depth of the peat isolates them from the influence of groundwater. They are known as raised bogs because the bog surface is raised in the middle, like a dome. The acidic conditions and poor levels of nutrients support a restricted but specialised range of species including heather, cottongrasses and, most importantly, *Sphagnum* mosses. These plants die to form peat that can be up to 12 metres deep.

In Ayrshire there are a number of raised bogs including Dykeneuk Moss, Cockinhead Moss, and Bankhead Moss.
