National Cycle Network

The National Cycle Network, is made up of 12,000 miles of signed cycle routes of which 2,000 miles are in Scotland. The network is a combination of traffic-free paths, quiet lanes and on-road cycling routes which are free to use and open to all. There are approximately 38 miles of National Cycle Network (NCN) in North Ayrshire made up of three routes:

- **NCN 7**, which is approximately 12 miles in length and follows sections of dismantled railway line and relatively quiet roads. The on-road section from Kilwinning to Kilbirnie is currently being re-evaluated to ascertain if a more traffic-free option can be secured. Highlights along the way include Kilwinning Abbey and, in Irvine, the New Town Trail (a 12 mile traffic-free route), the Scottish Maritime Museum and the Magnum Leisure Centre.
- **NCN 73**, which is approximately 5 miles in length and has both on and off-road sections, follows golden sandy beaches with views to Arran.
- **NCN 75**, which is approximately 21 miles in length and is largely on road, has sections that still need to be implemented. Highlights along the way include Kelburn Country Centre and Skelmorlie Castle.

The National Cycle Network is the flagship project of Sustrans, the UK's leading sustainable transport charity. Sustrans work on practical projects which enable people to choose to travel in ways that benefit their health and the environment.
