

## Brodick Bay

The map shows the Isle of Arran with several numbered points of interest:

- Point 1:** Located near Brodick Castle and the Nature Centre.
- Point 2:** Located near the western coast, near the Waterfalls and Gravestone.
- Point 3:** Located on the western coast, near the Waterfalls and Gravestone.
- Point 4:** Located near the eastern coast, near the Nature Centre and the Tidal Pond.
- Point 5:** Located near the southern coast, near the Waterfalls and Gravestone.
- Point 6:** Located near the eastern coast, near the Nature Centre and the Tidal Pond.

Key locations and features labeled on the map include:

- Waterfalls, Gravestone, and Standing Stones.
- Castles: Brodick Castle, Brodick Old Quay.
- Landmarks: Nature Centre, Sawmill, Cladach, NTL, Cnocan Bridge, Home Farm, Strabane, Rosa Bridge, Estate Office, Glenshurig Bridge, Glenshurig House, Heather Cottage, Woodburn, Burnbank, East Burnbank, Mill House, Glenshurig Burn, 37m, 53m, 73m, THE STRING, Stronach Wood, Standing Stone (recumbent), Dunes, Tidal Ponds, Tidal Pond, Golf Course, School, Clay Bridge, War Mem Ch, Liby, Ormidale Park, Hotel, Achnamara Spa Resort, Glen Cloy Farm, Sheepfold, Burnside, East Knowe Lodge, West Mayish, Mid Mayish, Alma Road, Hillview Place, and Rathwic Terrace.
- Roads and tracks: AR96, AR95, AR97, AR147, AR101, AR98, AR103, AR104, AR105, AR151, and AR104.
- Other: FB (Field Boundary), NTL (National Trail), MS (Metres), and various symbols for paths, tracks, and drains.



## Brodick Castle, Gardens and Country Park

The majestic Brodick Castle sits overlooking Brodick Bay, framed by the backdrop of Goatfell. As the ancient seat of the Dukes of Hamilton, Brodick Castle dates back 700 years and houses a superb collection of paintings, trophies, porcelain and silverware. Surrounding the Castle is one of Scotland's most unforgettable gardens, combining a formal walled garden with a magnificent woodland garden including towering rhododendrons and magnolias. Many of the plants were brought back by intrepid plant hunters from China, the Himalayas and Burma. In the wider Country Park there are over 10 miles of trails to explore with spectacular views, beautiful woodlands and dramatic watery gorges. For those keen on wildlife Brodick Castle Gardens and Country Park are excellent for spotting Arran's native red squirrels, whilst common and grey seals often bask on the rocks in Brodick Bay.


Throughout the year the National Trust for Scotland organises many events and guided walks including specialist gardens walks with the head gardener and wildlife walks with the Ranger Service.
