## **Lesson 6: Part 1**

**The Cathedral of the Isles is the smallest Cathedral in Great Britain, and possibly the world. It has stood since 1849, when it was constructed as an Episcopalian college. Today we will be learning more about the Cathedral and its history and place in Cumbræ.**

**What to do: Explore the Cathedral and its grounds to find out more about its history and its current day use. Make sure to talk to everyone! Use what you learn to answer the questions below**

- 4. Where was the Trahoun Cross found?**
- 5. What was the Bed and Breakfast originally used for?**

## Lesson 6: Part 2

It's been nearly 200 years since the Cathedral of the Isles was built. How would you do it today?

**What to do:** Sort yourselves into 4 teams. Your teacher will then each tell you the name of the part of the new Cathedral to build.

There are four areas to build:

**The Tower** - This is the bell tower for the church and will be the highest point of the building.

**The Church** - This is where mass is held and has things like the benches, altar and maybe some stained glass.

**The Residences** - This is the building on the side that currently has the library, hotel and organ - but you can do something different if you want!

**The Grounds** - These are the Cathedral grounds and can have walls, paths, graveyards, grass, benches or more - get creative!

Once you have your team together you can get building!

**Tip:** You do not need to exactly copy the current Cathedral on the island - feel free to get creative. Remember the most important thing is to cooperate and work together as a team - it's okay if you don't manage to finish it all.
